During the March 2021 quarter the Company obtained insurance premium funding of \$2 million from Ledge Finance Limited to finance the insurance program for the Henty mine. The interest rate is 2.7% and the financing is unsecured and repayable in 10 equal instalments by October 2021.

Henty Gold Pty Ltd, which was acquired on 20 January 2021 had a number of existing finance leases for various mine equipment and light vehicles. There are 4 finance leases with NAB for a value of \$500k with interest rates varying from 4% to 5.4% and maturing between February 2023 to August 2023. All are secured against the leased assets.
